


Kindness

Mr. Panda has presents for all his animal friends, but many of the gifts are not quite right--but as little Lemur knows, it is the thought that counts.




[The Big Umbrella](#) by Amy June Bates

A spacious umbrella welcomes anyone and everyone who needs shelter from the rain.




[Try a Little Kindness](#) by Henry Cole

Two best friends have each other's backs. When one friend sees the other doing something unkind, he steps in to show his friend the correct behavior.




[When We Are Kind](#) by Monique Gray Smith

This beautiful picture book looks at how the simple act of being kind, to others and oneself, affects all aspects of a child's life.




[Tomorrow I'll Be Kind](#) by Jessica Hische
